16	THE COURT FINDS AS FOLLOWS:	
17	1. On April 6, 2020, the Judicial Council issued Emergency Rules 1-13. Emergency	
18	Rule 1 limits the processing of unlawful detainer actions as specified. Pursuant to Emergency	
19	Rule 1, no summons may issue on any complaint for unlawful detainer unless the court finds in	
20	its discretion and on the record that the action is necessary to protect public health and safety.	
21	Pursuant to Emergency Rule 1, no default may be entered in any unlawful detainer action	
22	unless (1) it is necessary to protect public health and safety; and (2) the respondent has failed to	
23	appear in the time required by law as otherwise extended by Executive Order. Pursuant to	
24	Emergency Rule 1, any scheduled unlawful detainer trial is suspended for no less than 60 days,

1	unless necessary to protect public health and safety. Emergency Rule 1 became operative April		
2	6, 2020.		
3	2. On August 13, 2020, the Judicial Council adopted Circulating Order Number CO-20-		
4	13. CO-20-12 rescinds Emergency Rule 1 and sunsets the operation of certain provisions at		
5	close of business on September 1, 2020.		
6	BASED UPON THE ABOVE FINDINGS, IT IS ORDERED:		
7 8	1. Based upon the rescission of Emergency Rule 1, effective close of business on		
9	September 1, 2020, the Second Amended Standing Order regarding Unlawful Detainers is		
10	rescinded. Effective September 2, 2020, summons may issue on all unlawful detainer actions.		
11	The civil division may enter defaults and issue writs of execution as required by law.		
12	Unlawful detainer trials that are at issue may be set for trial upon request.		
13	2. By rescinding the Second Amended Standing Order Regarding Unlawful Detainer		
14	Action, the Court expresses no opinion regarding the legalities of any Executive Order or local		
15	ordinance or resolution adopted through the exercise of the police power of any local agency.		
16	IT IS SO ORDERED.
